

## Shared Learning at Home

Here are some activities for you to choose from this half term to do at home.

We expect you to complete a minimum of 3 by **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> February**.

You can bring in any of the work you have completed on any Monday to share with the class.

**Year 2 - same as year 1 and 3x, 4x, 8x**




**Make a New Year's Resolution.**

**Set up a shop in your home and roleplay selling items to your family.**

*Calculate cost and change given.*



**Visit somewhere in Wales.**  
*Take a photo and write about your day.*



**Go for a spring walk**  
*Collect interesting items, take photos or draw what you see.*

*Write key words.*



**Create something artistic to do with Wales.**

*This could be a story, an information leaflet, a poem, a recipe or a notice.*



**Make an Easter or Spring word search.**

*Think about the key words you need to sound out and spell.*



**Write about a time when you were brave.**

*Tell us all about it. Think about how you felt before and after.*



**Free choice**

*Think of something really special or interesting you would like to do or share. It could be anything you like that you would like to share with us.*
