The content of this booklet is informed by Welsh Government Operational Guidance (14/08/20) and the school risk assessment document.

Procedures & Expectations

How do I drop off my child?

- Please walk or use another form of personal transport to bring your child to school. Children and parents / carers **should not** car share with other families.
- All children in Nursery - Y3 **must be** accompanied onto the school site by one adult only.
- Children in Y4-6 are to walk onto the school site **unaccompanied**, unless they are with their parent who is bringing a younger sibling to school.
- You are advised **not** to bring other children with you wherever possible, however we do understand that this may not be possible for some families.
- There are staggered start times for your child to come to school:

	Drop off time slot
If you have one child in school	8.35am-8.45am
If you have more than one child in school	8.45am-8.55am

- Please do not come onto the top yard too early. You should not come onto the yard until a minute or two before your child's start time.
- **You must be on time within the time slot.** Late arrivals will find it difficult to access the school building and all timings have been planned carefully to ensure we can carry out all necessary safety procedures.
- Gates for entry and exit are clearly demarcated. There is one entrance (top gate by the post box near junction between Barker's Lane and Lisburne Grove) and one exit (middle gate by the steel barrier) for children and parents / carers.
- To ensure social distancing, there are markings on most of the playground for your child/ren to wait until they are called from the yard by a member of school staff.
- Arrows indicate where you follow the pathway to exit the yard at the middle gate. We ask that this is done efficiently, please do not wait while your child is going down the steps into the building as this will hold others up.
- Learners will be supervised by school staff from the top yard to the classroom, through designated doorways.
- All children will be supervised cleaning their hands when they enter school.
- Please do not attempt to pass information verbally to school staff at drop off or pick up time. Messages need to be directed to your child's classteacher through Seesaw, by email to the school office on mailbox@barkerslane-pri.wrexham.sch.uk or as a last resort by telephone.

Where do I pick up my child at the end of the session?

- All children in Nursery - Y3 must be collected by one adult / over school-age young person.
- Y4-6 children may walk home unsupervised providing we have permission. **This should be emailed to mailbox@barkerslane-pri.wrexham.sch.uk before your child returns to school.**

Y4, Y5 & Y6 (Who are walking home unaccompanied)	3.10pm	These children will be led to the back gate by a member of staff. You must have emailed permission to school for your child to walk home unaccompanied.

- The top gate is the entrance gate to the school grounds and the middle gate is the exit only if you are picking up from the top yard.
- To ensure social distancing, you are encouraged to use the markings on the playground to wait for their child.
- Children will come out to the yard with a member of school staff. You will need to walk towards this area to collect your child as staff indicate to you.
- Arrows direct where to walk away to exit the yard at the middle gate.
- If you are collecting your child from the bottom gate (Y4-6 only - see table on p4), please ensure that you are visible to school staff.
- **When a parent of a child in Y4, Y5 or Y6 has given permission for them to walk home, the child/ren will be taken each day to the back gate. To enable us all to be organised and safe, we are unable to accommodate requests for walk home some days / pick up on top yard of younger siblings other days.**
- Please do not try to pass messages etc to school staff. This should be done via Seesaw /email please.
- Parents and children must not congregate inside or outside school gates. You are respectfully asked to start your journey home straight away to maintain social distancing.

What if I am late?



- Windows of 'drop off' at staggered times are organised for the safety of all.
- Late arrivals will find it difficult to access the school building as there is very restricted admittance to the foyer.

What shall I do if my child is upset when they arrive or does not want to leave me?

- Our staff will do their best to support you to encourage your child to come in, whilst appropriately social distancing from you.
- For the safety of all, parents will not be able to come into the school building.

Will my child be able to walk to and from school on their own?

- Y4-6 children may walk home unsupervised providing we have permission.
- Permission for your child to walk home unaccompanied needs to be emailed to mailbox@barkerslane-pri.wrexham.sch.uk before they return to school.
- **When a parent of a child in Y4, Y5 or Y6 has given permission for them to walk home, the child/ren will be taken each day to the back gate. To enable us all to be organised and safe, we are unable to accommodate requests for walk home some days / pick up on top yard of younger siblings other days.**

Will wraparound care be available?

- Early morning, breakfast and after school club along with Nursery Plus will be available.
- Club are asking parents to only book places if this is **essential** as numbers are reduced to ensure that where they can contact groups can be kept together.
- This is particularly important in breakfast club which has traditionally been very busy. Please do not book a place unless you have no other options, like flexible working, etc. This will then ensure families who have no other option can access the provision.
- Although staff will be doing their best to keep small consistent contact groups in club, it is unlikely that this is practically possible. Therefore your child will be mixing with other children outside their class contact group.

What if my child or I am unwell or display symptoms of Covid-19?



- Children or parents / carers who are feeling unwell **or** displaying Covid-19 symptoms **must not** attend / visit school under any circumstances. **This includes when you may suspect that you have a cold / flu-like or other virus symptoms.**

- In this situation or anyone displaying symptoms should begin to self-isolate and arrange a test as soon as possible.
- If the test of the person showing symptoms is negative then your child can return to school on production of the text message / email displaying the results.
- If the test of the person showing symptoms is positive, then you should follow the advice of PHW and continue to isolate for at least ten days.
- Anyone who lives with someone displaying symptoms but remains well should still stay at home for 14 days from the day the first person became ill, if the test was positive.

What if my child becomes unwell at school?

- If your child becomes unwell **or** shows symptoms whilst they are at school, you will be contacted to collect them **immediately**.
- They will be kept in a separate area during this short time, under supervision by an adult from a safe distance.
- Once someone with suspected or confirmed symptoms in school is identified, all areas where this person has been will be kept clear. A thorough clean of the area will be arranged.

What does my child need to wear to school?

- Your child can wear their own clothes or their school polo shirt and sweatshirt / cardigan as long as it is clean on that morning.
- All of the children are asked to wear joggers / leggings / tracksuit bottoms please (rather than traditional school trousers / skirts).
- Our classrooms will have windows open all day to keep them well-ventilated, therefore a T-shirt and another layer like a sweatshirt / hoodie would be better than just a T-shirt, for example.
- Clean clothes must be worn each day.
- Clothing and **footwear need to be suitable for outdoor activity, ideally pumps or trainers** (no flimsy sandals / crocs / heeled shoes) as we will be intending to spend lots of time outside for learning and physical activity.

Will my child need a face covering?

- Primary age children do not need a face covering for school. The recent information and guidance published about face coverings applies to secondary schools, where larger groups of children are in close proximity in corridors and social spaces.
- At Barker's Lane, children will remain with their own class contact group all day.
- Although the evidence around face coverings differs, what is consistent is that with younger children, there is a greater risk of transmission of the virus due to them touching the face covering, their faces and surfaces.
- If your child has a face covering on when they arrive at school, they should remove this with you whilst on the yard after sanitising your own and their hands. Parents should place the face covering in a bag and take it away with them. Temporary face coverings should be disposed of by parents appropriately and reusable face coverings washed before reuse. Hands should then be sanitised after removal.
- If your child walks to school unaccompanied and wears a face covering, they will need to sanitise their hands on arrival at school and remove the face covering. Your child will then need to dispose of a temporary face covering in the 'tissue' pedal bin or place a reusable face covering in a plastic bag that you have provided, to be taken home with them, this will then be stored in their own tray. Parents need to wash the face covering before your child uses this again. Your child will then clean their hands before entering the classroom.

What does my child need to bring to school?

- A showerproof coat should be brought every day. Your child will also need a cap / hat in sunny weather. You may also want to provide your child with a small packet of tissue for their pocket.
- Sunscreen should be applied before your child comes to school. If they need reapplication during the session, they need to be able to apply this themselves as is our usual school policy.
- Your child also needs a full water bottle and a healthy snack for Y1-6 children. Nursery and Reception children will be provided with a snack for a small charge.
- Children who are not having school dinners will need a packed lunch.
- Children in Y1-6 are also asked to bring a small pencil case at the beginning of term which will remain in their school tray.
- If your child has emergency medication e.g. asthma inhaler, EpiPen, this should be brought to school.
- **Children in Y4, Y5 and Y6 who are walking to and from school unaccompanied only may bring a mobile phone if you so wish. As our usual rules, this will need to be switched off as they enter the school grounds and then placed in class storage with the teacher until hometime.** Any child who brings a mobile phone does so at their own risk. Anyone who breaks the rules will not be permitted to bring their phone to school.


What should my child not bring to school?



- Your child should only bring the above items.
- Children must not bring toys, teddies, drawings, etc from home into the school building.
- **Please do not send individual / small bottles of hand sanitiser to school with your child. We have ample stocks at school, located all around the building and in classrooms.** The reason for this is due to the content of hand sanitiser, issues around ingestion and ensuring children are supervised.

What will my child's class be like?

- We will be sharing revised child-friendly booklets and new videos on Seesaw to show your child what their class now looks like and help them understand some of the new routines.
- Most children are returning to their previous class teacher and will move to their new class over the first week or so, supported to transition as outlined in the email sent at the end of the Summer term.
- Generally, older children will be sat side by side and forward facing. Younger children will sit in more traditional groups and access various provision which has been assessed for safety.
- Areas around school are marked out for social distancing for adults and on-way systems are in place.
- Members of staff within the class will be available to deal with toileting, disinfecting of equipment and to remind pupils of good personal hygiene throughout the school day.
- Learning will be outdoors wherever practically possible.
- Collective worship will be held within groups indoors / outdoors. No large group gatherings are permitted.
- Each child in Y1-6 will have their own stationary for their personal use throughout the day which they will keep in their tray. Writing implements and other stationary used by Early Years children will be regularly replaced and quarantined or cleaned throughout the day.
- All equipment is sanitised after use at the end of the day or placed in quarantine.
- Large equipment e.g. bikes, scooters, etc will be sanitised after use.
- Digital devices will be cleaned between use.



What happens at break time?

- Time outdoors as a class is scheduled throughout the day. Teachers will plan structured and recreational activities.
- Where we can, we will encourage older children to maintain a distance and keep their hands to themselves, but we **cannot** guarantee this.
- In Y1-6, your child needs to bring their own healthy snack with them to eat in class, which they need to be able to peel or open independently.
- All children will clean their hands before and after eating, and on return from outside.

What will happen at lunchtime?

- Your child can bring a packed lunch or can have a hot school meal,
- **Your child needs to be able to peel / open all snack and items in lunchboxes independently.** This may require you to practise with your child or think about containers that these are put in.
- For school dinners, a two week menu has been devised by the school meals service. All meals will be served in disposable containers with compostable cutlery.
- All meals must be paid for in advance online using your child's WCBC unique number (not our SchoolMoney app). No cash to be sent in to school please.
- If your child is eligible for free school meals, WCBC are continuing to make payments until 11th September. Therefore families will need to pay for a meal or provide a packed lunch for their child. From Monday 14th September, free school meals will revert to their normal service.

- Reception and Year 1 children will eat their lunch in the hall in two separate sittings. All other children will eat lunch in their classroom at staggered times. Playtime with their own class is also planned on a staggered basis.

Can you guarantee that my child will always be able to keep a social distance from others?

- Guidance for children in primary schools is on separating class groups rather than individual children.
- Where we can, we will encourage older children to maintain a distance and keep their hands to themselves, but we **cannot** guarantee this.
- Children will be discouraged from touching staff, in an age appropriate way.
- We will be encouraging this and endeavour to do our very best, doing what we can that is practicable.
- There will be no unsupervised movement of children around the school building.
- All school staff have to maintain a safe distance from each other and yourselves as parents.



Will my child have plenty of opportunities to clean their hands?

- Soap and hot water will be available in all hand washing areas.
- All children and staff will clean their hands:
 - on arrival at and when leaving school
 - before and after handling food
 - before and after handling objects and equipment that may have been used by others
 - where there has been any physical contact
 - after blowing their nose, sneezing or coughing.
- Hand sanitiser is available on entry to school, in each classroom, other areas around the building and will be taken outdoors.
- **Please do not send individual / small bottles of hand sanitiser to school with your child. We have ample stocks at school, located all around the building and in classrooms.** The reason for this is due to the content of hand sanitiser, issues around ingestion and ensuring children are supervised.



Will my child be able to use the toilet when they need to or are there going to be toilet breaks?

- We will be limiting numbers of children who can access the toilets at any time to no more than two from different contact groups or only children within a contact group.
- Your child will be able to go to the toilet when they need to. Children will need to ask an adult, who will then check the area is not in use by another contact group.
- Your child can independently use the cubicle and wash their hands in a designated sink for their class.
- We will also be having toilet breaks which will be supervised by school staff.
- High-touch points, like flush handles, door locks, taps and soap dispensers will continue to be cleaned more regularly throughout the day.

What if my child does not or other children do not follow the rules?

- Rules will be shared with all children in an age-appropriate way. As parents / carers, you can support with this by talking to your child about good respiratory hygiene, cleaning their hands thoroughly and the importance of keeping everyone safe.
- We recognise that some children may not be able to follow safety rules for developmental reasons. We will be discussing this on a case by case basis to risk assess whether every child can access a check in place at this time.



- Where a child makes a choice to break rules which compromise the health and safety of the individual, other children or school staff, parents will be contacted to discuss this and a formal plan may need to be put in place.
- If you are concerned that your child may find it difficult to follow rules which may compromise safety, please contact school via mailbox@barkerslane-pri.wrexham.sch.uk to discuss this.

Will there be extra cleaning?

- Cleaning staff will ensure that all surfaces are thoroughly cleaned after the children and staff have gone home.
- Allocated staff will clean surfaces, door handles and equipment throughout the day. Hard surfaces will be cleaned with warm soapy water or normal cleaning products. Particular attention will be given to 'high-touch' areas and surfaces e.g. bathrooms, tables, toys, equipment, door handles, push pads, taps and hand sanitiser / soap dispensers.
- Rooms will be cleaned thoroughly between different groups using the room.
- We have a dedicated pedal bin in each class for tissues which are disposed of safely. All waste is removed daily.
- Additional cleaning of toilets, sinks and other high touch points will be undertaken during the day.

What can we I do to prepare my child?

- Talk to your child about how we can keep safe if you have not already. There is lots of support in the Parent Section – Support & Safeguarding, on the school website.
- Teach your child how to sneeze and cough into their elbow or a tissue and dispose of it. 
- Ensure your child knows how to wash and dry their hands thoroughly and independently.
- Remind your child about 'keeping their hands to themselves' where this is age appropriate.
- Practise peeling fruit and opening packets / tubs for snack / food stuffs.
- Practise dressing / undressing and turning clothing the right way around with independence.
- Support school by talking to your child about following rules.

What if my child needs first aid?

- If attending to any wounds, etc school staff will use Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) at all times.
- Each class has its own supply of PPE and first aid materials.
- If a child was seriously injured or someone with a medical condition needed to be admitted to hospital, parents would be contacted, and emergency services would be called.
- Staff members are unlikely to be able to accompany a child in an ambulance in the event that a parent / carer cannot get to school in time.

What if my child has a toileting accident or is sick during the session?

- School staff would wear PPE to look after your child's needs in these cases at all times.
- As much as possible, with wetting / soiling, your child will be encouraged to be as independent as possible to wipe themselves and change, as per our usual school policy.
- If your child has been sick, again our staff will do their best to help them clean up as independently as possible. You would be contacted to collect your child immediately.

Will my child be doing P.E or need their P.E kit?

- We have asked all children to come dressed in suitable clothing for outdoor activity. Ideally pumps / trainers should be worn for footwear. Your child does not need a P.E kit. (We will review this during the term and let you know in plenty of time if this changes).

- We will be doing physical activities, but these will be a little different to usual P.E and undertaken outside at all times.
- Any equipment used will be cleaned after use.



Will I be able to pop into school to speak to my child's teacher or the school office?

- Any parental request / query will need to be directed to your child's teacher via Seesaw, emailed to mailbox@barkerslane-pri.wrexham.sch.uk or telephone as a last resort, wherever possible.
- Face to face access to the school building will not be available for parents.
- Discussions with teachers will be conducted by telephone or video conference and not within the school building at this time. *We will be keeping this under review in line with health and safety guidance.*

Will my child be offered a flu immunisation?

- All children in Reception to Year 6 will be offered the opportunity to have a nasal spray flu vaccine at school in October.
- The school office will be emailing a letter to you shortly from the Immunisation Team and sending home a consent form which will need to be returned to school as soon as possible, if you wish your child to have the vaccine.
- We have been informed by the immunisation team that most parents offered a flu vaccine for their child choose to vaccinate. They also state that flu vaccine usually offers children good protection against flu in the season that it is given and that it helps reduce the chance of spreading flu to those at higher risk from flu.
