Dear Parent / Carer

Yesterday we received a letter from the Minister confirming that Key Stage 2 pupils can return to school from 15<sup>th</sup> March.

The plans we shared on Tuesday have had to be changed in line with Welsh Government's directive.

All Key Stage 2 pupils will now be welcomed back to school together on **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> March**.

### **Check In and Catch Up Appointment**

Your child's teacher will offer you the opportunity to book a short virtual appointment with them if you feel that you would like this. This will be a short catch up to see how your child is and will support us with our planning. Your child's teacher will give you more details about this on Seesaw. Dates are below:

### **Updated - Frequently Asked Questions - FAQs**

The Frequently Asked Questions **at the end of this letter have been updated** to reflect the information that you need.

### **Risk Assessment**

As you will appreciate, we have had to review all of our measures again for wider re-opening. The main messages in our Welsh Government guidance remain mostly unchanged but it just asks schools to be as robust and consistent as possible.

There are some new measures set out by Welsh Government:

- Parents / carers should wear a good quality face covering when coming onto the school premises at all times.
- School staff have been offered twice weekly lateral flow testing to detect asymptomatic cases.
- Where social distancing is not possible in the classrooms, school staff may wear face coverings whilst teaching.

There will be some further tweaks to this as it is updated again next week to take account of the return of the juniors.

### **Polling Day – Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> May**

The school has been notified that we will be a polling station on **Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> May**. Due to the restrictions and changes in access arrangements currently, **we will have to close school on this day**. To mitigate this, school will now be open on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March which was originally a staff training day and we will move our staff training day to Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> May. Club will be running holiday club on 6<sup>th</sup> May for any parents who will need to book in. **Unfortunately this is something that is out of our control.**

## **Updated - Frequently Asked Questions – FAQs**

These questions have been updated to reflect the most up to date Welsh Government Guidance.

### **What are the arrangements for my child in Key Stage 2 coming back to school?**

All children in Key Stage 2 will be welcomed back to school on **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> March**. Arrangements for drop-off and pick up are outlined further in this information.

### **Where and what time do I drop off /collect my child?**

When your child returns to school they will still need to be dropped off and picked up on the main school yard unless they have written permission to walk home unaccompanied.

The entrance gate is at the top corner of the yard and the exit gate near the barrier, these have not changed.

**Parents must leave the premises quickly and not congregate by gates or on Barkers Lane. Please socially distance at all times.**

**If your child has not walked home from school unaccompanied before but you would like them to start doing this, please email permission to the school office.**

### **Can my child go home with another child, have play dates, sleep overs or parties with children in their own class?**

Unfortunately not. Please do not compromise school staff by informing them that your child is being collected by another parent in the class.

If someone from your household is unable to drop off / pick up your child. Please ensure that wherever possible it is only one other adult who does this to keep contacts to a minimum.

The following information is from the Welsh Government 'No, out of school restrictions identical to those 'stay at home' requirements imposed on the general population, must be applied rigorously. Contact groups ('school bubbles') only apply within the school setting.'

### **Will I be able to book Wraparound Care?**

It is very important to protect this space that has been afforded to enable plans for children to return to school to happen. Therefore some restricted arrangements will be in place for a short time to reduce any additional mixing between contact groups.

**Breakfast Club (8.10am-8.25am)** – Numbers are **restricted and we ask that parents only book this provision if absolutely necessary.** All bookings must be made on the SchoolMoney app by 5.30pm on Thursday of the week before. *If you are having any problems booking a place, please email Mrs Brand on [RobinsonC38@hwbcymru.net](mailto:RobinsonC38@hwbcymru.net)*

Unfortunately, at present Club are unable to run the early morning session but will update parents about this themselves if they are able to re-instate this.

**After School Club (3.10pm-5.30pm)** – Numbers are **restricted.** All bookings must be made on the SchoolMoney app by 5.30pm on Thursday of the week before. *If you are having any problems booking a place, please email Mrs Brand on [RobinsonC38@hwbcymru.net](mailto:RobinsonC38@hwbcymru.net)*

*Welsh Government guidance suggests keeping the use of wraparound provision to the minimum that you need as using multiple settings increases the chance of your child needing to isolate as a contact if a positive case is reported.* As a school, we do appreciate that for many families, this care is essential though.

### What are the lunchtime arrangements?

All children attending school will be able to have a school meal or bring a packed lunch as normal. School meals are £2.40 per day and must be paid for online in advance using the WCBC payment system (not SchoolMoney app). **We can not accept any cash at school.**

If your child is bringing a packed lunch, please ensure that items have been prepared to enable your child to open / access everything independently. E.g. If your child needs support, peel fruit and place in container, open packets, etc.

*Our staff are available and willing to help, however please bear in mind there are one or two of them with thirty children and they have to wash their hands between handling items in individual lunchboxes, therefore we ask this to prevent some children waiting considerable time for any help.*

### What can and can't my child bring to school?

Nothing has changed in relation to this.

Please send your child to school with their water bottle, a piece of fruit /vegetables for snack and a lunchbox if they are having a packed lunch. **NO other bags, toys, items from home to be brought in please.**

### What should my child wear to school?

Again nothing has changed in relation to this.

Your child should wear their school polo shirt, sweatshirt / cardigan and jogging pants / leggings with suitable outdoor footwear. They can of course wear school trousers if you so wish.

We advise that your child wears layers of clothing which they can independently take on and off as Foundation Phase children always spend lots of time outside whatever the weather and when indoors, at present it is vital that our classrooms are kept well ventilated.

All children require a warm waterproof coat. **Please ensure your child has their name clearly labelled in all of their items of clothing.**

### Will my child need their P.E kit?

Not before Easter. If this changes after Easter, we will let you know in plenty of time before the holiday

### Will online learning continue to be provided if my child does not return to school?

When and during the phased return for Key Stage 2 pupils begins, a remote learning grid will still be provided when children are not in a group attending school. Once the phase in is complete, remote learning will stop.

Once a date is set for a full return to school and you choose to keep your child home, there will be no remote learning provided on a daily basis. This would be unmanageable for teachers, however your child would have access to all of the previous learning on Seesaw, Active Learn, Bug Club and their home learning grid.

### What will happen if I choose not to send my child back to school at this time?

The latest guidance from Welsh Government has changed since before half term around attendance. There is an expectation that as schools open up that all children who are eligible should begin attending again. However we do appreciate that some families will be anxious about this.

Once a date is confirmed, if your child will not be returning to school, please contact Mrs Edwards at school to discuss this to help us understand your reasons. We will then be able to work with families to make a plan for engagement.

At present Welsh Government do not deem it appropriate for Local Authorities to issue fixed penalties for absence unless school had previous concerns.

### Will I need to wear a face covering on the yard?

Yes. Welsh Government have stipulated that all parents, unless exempt, should wear a face covering when entering school premises.

### How can I contact my child's teacher or speak to the school office?
